Mesrams begin Nagoba Jatara, the second largest tribal fair in Telangana

Adilabad: Mesrams, a clan from aboriginal tribal communities initiated the process of worshipping Nagoba or serpentine god or Nagoba Jatara, a five-day long important religious and cultural affair of these people with the onset of new moon. A decision to this effect was made by elders, priests and members of the clan who convened a meeting on the premises of Nagoba temple at Keslapur village in Indervelli mandal on Monday night. According to the elders, priests and Mesrams decided to begin Kachur Prachar or publicity about Mahapuja slated for January 18 by a bullock cart in seven villages from Tuesday. They then place an order to buy sacred pots to be used for performing various rituals during the fair at Rajampet village in Sirikonda mandal. Following the activity, the Mesrams would embark on an arduous task of fetching sacred water from Godavari river at Kalamadugu in Jannaram mandal before performing special prayers at Nagoba temple in Keslapur village in Indervelli mandal by trekking covering a distance of over 150 kilometers and passing through 150 tribal villages enroute. Traditionally, they bring holy water in Jhari, a 1,400-year-old brass container used for carrying the water. Distinctively, the tribal clan uses pots and various utensils made of clay and molded



by a family of potters residing at Sirikonda mandal centre. They fetch water in the pots from a holy pond situated near the temple of Nagoba and consecrate Naivedyam or offering to the presiding deity by cooking it in these pots. Around 100 Mesrams would ceremoniously perform Mahapuja and Satheek puja, to kick start the affair. They then worship Persapen or the great god and Banpen puja the next day. Bheting, introduction of new daughters-in-law to the deity, Mandagajili puja and Betal Puja, Praja Darbara or grievance redressal programme etc are going to be held as part of the fair. Nagoba Jatara, a five-day-long annual important and religious affair of Mesrams, is the second largest congregation of tribals after the biennial Sammakka Saralamma jatara at Medaram in Mulugu district. Ethnic tribes belonging to several parts of not only Telangana, but also Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh and Chhattisgarh visit the temple and perform prayers during the fair.

Hyderabad city guide This expenditure was made in contrast to Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy's repeated assertions over lack of funds for extending retirement benefits, to clear pending allowances to employees and contractors bills. any are also pointing out the Chief Minister's claims that he often travels in economy class to save money for the government. Contradicting this, the government spent Rs.13.50 lakh for a briefing session. The Congress government's double standards are evoking sharp criticism from different sections, especially over social media. Deputy Chief Minister Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka had held a meeting with MPs from the State at Praja Bhavan on March 8 this year. The meeting was held to brief the MPs on demands and pending issues pertaining to the State to be raised in the Parliament. Copies of the government or-

der issued by the planning department on December 22 sanctioning the bill amounts are being shared extensively in social media. Accordingly, Hotel Taj Krishna, Banjara Hills was paid Rs.8.43 lakh, Hotel The Plaza, Begumpet was paid Rs.1.95 lakh, NM Company was paid Rs.3.06 lakh, Anjali Florists, Himayathnagar was paid Rs.6,000 and Santhosh Enterprises, Malakpet was paid Rs.7,200. The total bill amount for the briefing session was Rs.13,59,217. Questions are being raised over the State government's priorities particularly after it repeatedly expressed concerns over loan repayment and lack of funds for executing development works. "Strangely, the Congress government keeps raising concerns over debts and loan repayments and the challenges in raising new loans. On the other hand, huge amounts are spent on meetings," Pavanbrs6, an X user said.



5 policemen killed in attack in Pakistan's Khyber Pakhtunkhwa

Peshawar: Unidentified armed assailants opened fire at a police van, killing five policemen in Pakistan's restive Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province on Tuesday, officials said. The incident occurred in the Karak district when the police officials were on a routine patrol. District Police Officer (DPO) Saud Khan said that all five police personnel in the van have been killed in the attack. A heavy contingent of police rushed to the spot, cordoned off the area, and began collecting evidence. A search operation to apprehend the attackers was launched. Chief Minister Sohail Afridi strongly condemned the attack in the Karak district, describing the incident as "highly unfortunate" and "deplorable." He added that



maintaining law and order across the province remains the top priority of the government and that such cowardly attacks cannot weaken the resolve of the state and security institutions. The government accuses the banned terror outfit Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) of carrying out terror attacks, especially in provinces bordering Afghanistan, after its ceasefire deal ended in November 2022.

Two years of Congress rule: Adilabad farmers slap themselves with footwear



Adilabad: Resenting that the two-year-long Congress ruling was nothing short of slapping themselves with slippers, residents staged a unique protest by beating themselves using their own footwear at Mukhra (K) village on Tuesday. Men from the village gathered at a farm and took part in the protest, expressing their ire against the government for failing to fulfill its poll promises. Unrest unlimited: On the crisis in Bangladesh

The violent unrest that rocked Bangladesh on Thursday night, following the death of Sharif Osman Hadi, a prominent youth leader of the July 2024 uprising against Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina's government, was both a reflection of where the country stands today and a warning of what lies ahead. Hadi, an Islamist and a virulent critic of India, played a key role in transforming the July uprising into a broader movement aimed at remaking the country. He sought a decisive break from Bangladesh's liberation-era values and advocated greater political space for parties such as Jamaat-e-Islami, as well as for Islamist student groups. Hadi was shot by masked gunmen on December 12 and succumbed to injuries on December 18 at a hospital in Singapore, triggering widespread protests across Bangladesh. Although the police have arrested at least half a dozen suspects in connection with the attack, it remains unclear who orchestrated the killing. Some of Hadi's supporters blamed the Awami League. On December 18, mobs torched the offices of Prothom Alo and The Daily Star, two of the country's largest dailies, trapping staff inside. Cultural centres, Awami League offices, the homes of former ministers, and even the residence of Mujibur Rahman, Bangladesh's liberation hero, were attacked. In Mymensingh city, a Hindu man aged 25 was lynched over alleged blasphemy, as a crowd cheered and filmed while his hanging body was set on fire.


Fifteen months after Ms. Hasina was toppled, Bangladesh continues to reel under mob rule. Ms. Hasina's authoritarianism undoubtedly contributed to the eruption of public anger in July 2024. Her fall offered Bangladesh a chance to begin anew, grounded in reconciliation, pluralism, and democracy. That opportunity has since been squandered. The period following the uprising saw widespread violence against minorities and Awami League workers. The Awami League and its student wing, the Chhatra League, were banned, while the ban on Jamaat-e-Islami was lifted. Muhammad Yunus failed to keep Islamist forces, who have a dark past, in check even as reactionary groups pressed for a total rupture with the immediate past. The result has been near-anarchy. Anti-India sentiments, amplified by Islamist forces, have further inflamed tensions. Bangladesh's rulers must heed these warning signs. The focus must shift from vendetta politics to rebuilding state capacity and restoring law and order. Mr. Yunus appears to lack either the legitimacy or the resolve to steer the country through this crisis. For Bangladesh, the only viable path forward lies in inclusive elections with the participation of all the major political parties.

Passenger beaten by off-duty Air India Express pilot suffers nasal fracture, seeks justice

New Delhi: A passenger allegedly assaulted by an off-duty Air India Express pilot at the Delhi airport has said a CT scan confirmed a displacement of his left nasal bone. The complainant, Ankit Dewan, said he is now seeking justice in the matter. Dewan said he has submitted a written complaint to the Delhi Police and learned through media reports that an FIR has been filed. "I am right now focusing on my health, and a CT scan today showed a displaced fracture of left nasal bone. I hope I get justice in the matter," Dewan said. The Delhi Police on Monday said based on Dewan's complaint received via email, a case has been registered under sections 115 (voluntarily causing hurt), 126 (wrongful restraint) and 351 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sahita (BNS), 2023. An investigation is underway, they said. Earlier, the police had said they had not received a formal

KTR pays tributes to PV Narasimha Rao on death anniversary

Hyderabad: Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) Working President KT Rama Rao on Tuesday paid rich tributes to Bharat Ratna PV Narasimha Rao, the former Prime Minister of India, on his 21st death anniversary, calling him the architect of modern India and a source of immense pride for Telangana. Telangana tourism guide He described Rao as "the builder of new India and Telangana's beloved son" and emphasised that Rao is a matter of pride for the entire nation."As Prime Minister, economist, politician, reformer, and a scholar, the services rendered by PV Narasimha Rao are eternally memorable," he noted. He hailed Rao's economic reforms as historic, noting that they "paved the way for the construction of modern India." Hyderabad city guide KT Rama Rao also highlighted the honours bestowed upon Rao by the previous BRS government after the formation of Telangana state in 2014. The K

Entering this Adilabad village by wearing footwear can attract a fine of Rs 5,000



Adilabad: In a tradition that looks somewhat strange to modern society, ethnic tribals set a rule restricting outsiders from entering their village wearing footwear for not just a day or two, but entire a month. Those who violate the rule are required to pay a fine of Rs 5,000. They put up a flex poster stating the norm at their village, Thummuguda in Indervelli mandal on Monday. Their self-mandate has become a talk of the town. Aboriginal tribals locally known as Adivasis worship their deities in the holy month Pushya or Poos starting from Tuesday and end-

ing on January 22. As part of their ancient tradition, the tribals observe an austere routine every day. They shun consumption of liquor, smoking, sleep on ground and walk barefoot during this sacred period. The residents imposed a rule mandating outsiders to duly enter the village by leaving their slippers on the village outskirts. They cautioned that those who flout the norm would have to pay the fine. "Not only locals, but also outsiders must respect the traditions of our village. We have been following this distinct culture for many decades," Kesav Rao, an elder from Thummuguda said.


Karnataka Hyderabad Bus Skids Off Road On Nh 65 Near Sangareddy

Hyderabad doctors call for AEDs in public spaces, CPR training in schools



Hyderabad: The first few minutes of a medical emergency often decide how well a patient recovers. However, more often than not, by the time such patients are wheeled into a hospital's emergency wing, the 'golden window' has closed. To prevent these avoidable deaths, public health specialists in Hyderabad are advocating for public places to be made emergency-friendly for such patients and integrating basic emergency medical training into school curriculum. For several years, Dr B Vijaya Rao, senior emergency cardiac resuscitation specialist from Hyderabad, has been pushing the State government to equip high-traffic public zones in Hyderabad, like the metro, railway stations, and bus terminals like JBS and MGBS, to handle cardiac emergencies. "There is a dire need for our public spaces to be equipped with Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs), in addition to ensuring there are trained individuals who can handle these devices. Prompt administration of CPR and AED within five to six minutes of a cardiac arrest improves chances of survival of patients by 80 per cent. Why can't we have such life-saving equipment in public spaces?" asks Dr Vijaya Rao, the US-trained master instructor in Advanced Cardiovascular Life Support (ACLS).

Expanding on this vision of community empowerment, senior pediatrician from Hyderabad, Dr Sivarajani Santosh, has launched a campaign, urging the State government to include CPR and first-aid choking, seizures, fainting, fever, diarrhoea, nose bleed, etc in the school syllabus from class 7. In most emergencies, bystanders have less than 4 minutes to act, yet over 90 per cent of people do not know CPR or basic first aid. In India, thousands of children lose their lives every year because help does not arrive in time, Dr Sivarajani points out. "Students above 12 years can easily learn CPR, choking response, seizure first aid, and emergency skills. Schools are where children spend most of their day, making school-based training essential. I request the State government to include a mandatory first-aid and emergency response module in schools," she said. Public spaces in Hyderabad should be made cardiac-responsive RTC, railway and other public spaces must be equipped with AEDs. First Aid and Emergency Response should be made part of school syllabus

12 Rameswaram fishermen held by Sri Lankan Navy amid Palk Strait tensions



Chennai: Sri Lankan naval personnel on Tuesday arrested at least 12 fishermen from Tamil Nadu's coastal belt on charges of allegedly poaching in international waters, once again highlighting the persistent tensions faced by Indian fishermen in the Palk Strait region. According to officials of the Tamil Nadu Fisheries Department, the fishermen hailed from Rameswaram and Thangachimadam in Ramanathapuram district. The fishermen were reportedly engaged in fishing activities in the waters between Dhanushkodi and Talaimannar when they were intercepted by a surveillance unit of the Sri Lankan Navy. Fisheries department officials said the Sri Lankan naval patrol apprehended the fishermen and escorted them, along with their mechanised trawler, to a naval port in Sri Lanka for further legal proceedings. The arrested fishermen have been accused of crossing the maritime boundary and fishing illegally in Sri Lankan waters, a charge that Indian fishermen frequently dispute, citing the narrow and contested nature of the fishing zone. On Monday (December 22), around 450 fishing tokens were issued to fishermen operating from the Rameswaram fishing jetty, indicating a large-scale fishing operation in the region.

ahead of the Christmas and New Year period. Officials revealed that the seized trawler belonged to Jothibas, a fisherman from Manthoppu in Thangachimadam. Though the vessel was reportedly not formally registered with the authorities, it had obtained a fishing token, raising questions about regulatory lapses. Among the 12 arrested fishermen are Prabhat (28), James Heiton (29), and Antony (32), all of whom are said to be the sole breadwinners for their families. News of their arrest has triggered anxiety among fishing communities across Rameswaram and neighbouring coastal villages. Local fishermen expressed deep concern over the recurring arrests and the impounding of boats, which they say severely affects their livelihoods. They have appealed to both the Tamil Nadu government and the Union government to intervene diplomatically and secure the early release of the arrested fishermen and the confiscated trawler. Meanwhile, fishermen's associations in the region are expected to convene an emergency meeting later on Tuesday to deliberate on the incident and decide on the next course of action, including possible protests and appeals for sustained government intervention.

US warns of delays in H-1B, H-4 visa processing after new rules

Hyderabad: The US government has indicated that H-1B and H-4 non-immigrant work visa processing may take longer than usual due to new rules that have come into force on December 15. Hyderabad city guide While the US Embassies and consulates across the world continue to accept and process H-1B and H-4 non-immigrant visa applications, the US Embassy in India urged the applicant to apply as early as they can. "Anticipate additional processing time for these visa classifications," it said in an advisory to applicants on Monday. Commencing December 15, the US Department of State has extended the online presence review of all H-1B and H-4 applicants as part of standard visa screening. The H-1B and their H-4 dependents have to mandatorily make their social media accounts public, disclose their usernames or IDs used on major platforms, including Facebook, X (formerly Twitter), Instagram, LinkedIn, and YouTube, even if the accounts are inactive in the past five years. This is being done to ensure thorough background checks on the applicants. "This vetting is being conducted globally for all applicants of all nationalities for H-1B and H-4 visas. It is an effort to address abuse of the H-1B programme while still per-



mitting companies to hire the best of the best temporary foreign workers," said the US Embassy in India. This rule has already placed jobs of hundreds of Indians at risk, as the H-1B and H-4 visa appointments scheduled on or after December 15 have been rescheduled to as late as October 2026. Indians who returned for their visa appointment are stranded as their visa dates have been postponed. Several of them have already lost their jobs and many are pitching for remote working from abroad. However, the companies are not inclined to permit as it violates Labour Condition Application and other visa rules. Meanwhile, major technology companies, including Google, Microsoft, Apple and ServiceNow, cautioned their H-1B and H-4 visa-holding employees against travelling abroad, citing prolonged delays at the US Embassies that could leave them stranded outside the US for a long time.

Bangladesh summons Indian envoy over security concerns for missions

Dhaka: Indian High Commissioner to Bangladesh, Pranay Verma, was on Tuesday summoned to Bangladesh's Ministry of Foreign Affairs amid concerns over the security of Bangladeshi missions in India. Bangladesh's Foreign Secretary Asad Alam Siam summoned the Indian High Commissioner, Prothomalo.com reported. Diplomatic sources confirmed the

matter. According to the sources, Verma was summoned in light of the emerging security situation surrounding Bangladesh missions located in various parts of India, including New Delhi and Kolkata, the report added. Diplomatic sources said that Verma has been requested to ensure strengthened security for Bangladesh missions located in various parts of India.

INSV Kaundinya to set off on voyage to Oman on Dec 29

New Delhi: INSV Kaundinya, the Navy's pioneering stitched sailing vessel built using traditional techniques, will undertake her maiden overseas voyage to Oman starting December 29, officials said on Tuesday. The vessel will be flagged off from Porbandar in Gujarat for Muscat, symbolically retracing the historic maritime routes that connected India with the wider Indian Ocean world for millennia.

Inspired by depictions of ancient Indian ships and constructed entirely using traditional stitched-plank techniques, INSV Kaundinya represents a rare convergence of history, craftsmanship and modern naval expertise, the defence ministry said. The Indian Navy's pioneering stitched sailing vessel, which revives India's ancient shipbuilding and seafaring traditions, will undertake her maiden overseas voyage on December 29, it said.

"Unlike contemporary vessels, her wooden planks are stitched together using coconut coir rope and sealed with natural resins, reflecting a shipbuilding tradition once prevalent along India's coasts and across the Indian Ocean," the ministry said. This technology enabled Indian mariners to undertake long-distance voyages to West Asia, Africa and Southeast



Asia long before the advent of modern navigation and metallurgy, the officials said. The project was undertaken through a tripartite agreement between the Ministry of Culture, the Indian Navy and Hodi Innovations as part of India's efforts to rediscover and revive indigenous knowledge systems. "Built by traditional artisans under the guidance of master shipwright Shri Babu Sankaran and supported by extensive research, design and testing by the Indian Navy and academic institutions, the vessel is fully seaworthy and capable of oceanic navigation," the ministry said in a statement. Named after the legendary mariner Kaundinya, who is believed to have sailed from India to Southeast Asia in ancient times, the ship embodies India's historic role as a maritime nation.

Chaos at Bangladesh High Commission as VHP, Bajrang Dal protesters clash with police

New Delhi: Holding saffron flags and shouting slogans against the lynching of a Hindu man in Bangladesh, hundreds of supporters of the VHP and the Bajrang Dal broke barricades and clashed with police near the fortified Bangladesh High Commission on Tuesday. Protesters forced several barricades down as police struggled to contain the surge. The high security area witnessed a beefed-up police presence in the morning ahead of the protest announced by the Hindu right against the lynching of a Hindu man in the strife-torn neighbouring nation. The area had been secured with three layers of barricades and a reinforced presence of police and paramilitary. An officer said a 15,000-strong police force was deployed ahead of the demonstration. He said police managed to hold the protesters about 800 metres from the high commission. DTC buses were arched as an obstacle to thwart the protesters' bid to reach the high commission. A sea of banners and placards bobbed in the air, reading denunciatory messages against the Bangladesh government. A placard read: "Hindu rakt ki ek boond ka hisaab chahiye (Each drop of blood of a Hindu must be ac-



ounted for)." On December 18, Dipu Chandra Das, a 25-year-old garment factory worker, was lynched by a mob and his body set on fire over blasphemy in Baluka in Mymensingh. According to the police, Das was first beaten up by a mob outside the factory and then hanged from a tree. The crowd left the body of the deceased by the Dhaka-Mymensingh Highway and later set it on fire. "A Hindu man was brutally assaulted and killed. We request our government to take strict action against those who are behind the killing. We also demand that the Bangladesh police take strict action against those who are behind the killing," a protester said. Another said, "We in India consider every community as our brothers and sisters. Every Hindu in every country must be treated in the same way."

Delhi HC dismisses plea of Hizbul chief's sons against framing of charges in terror funding case

New Delhi: The Delhi High Court on Tuesday dismissed the pleas of two sons of Hizbul Mujahideen chief Syed Salahuddin and others challenging framing of charges against them in a terror funding case. A bench of Justices Vivek Chaudhary and Manoj Jain rejected the appeals on the ground that they were not maintainable. According to the National Investigation Agency (NIA), the case pertains to the transfer of funds through hawala channels by Pakistan-based terrorists to Jammu and Kashmir, in a criminal conspiracy hatched with some operatives in India, to fuel and fund the secessionist and terrorist activities in Jammu and Kashmir. While Salahuddin's son Shahid Yousuf was arrested in October 2017, his other son Syed Ahmad Shakeel was arrested by the NIA on August 30, 2018, from his Srinagar residence in connection with the terror funding case lodged in 2011. The NIA had said Yousuf was arrested on the allegations of receiving funds



from Hizbul Mujahideen from abroad and was charge-sheeted in 2018.
